RE: SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITY REPORT

Dear Mayor Fenty:

This report is to inform you of the results of an investigation that was conducted by Special Agent Thomas Trimble, District of Columbia Office of the Inspector General (OIG), concerning allegations of fraud committed against the District of Columbia Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) by Jamial A. Cunningham, a former employee of the District of Columbia Fire and Emergency Medical Services.

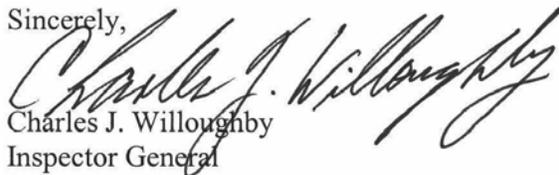
This investigation revealed that on June 3, 2005, Cunningham solicited cash payments from individuals who owed the DMV for unpaid parking citations. Cunningham, in concert with others, used a stolen credit card to pay the parking citations, via the DMV online payment system.

On May 14, 2007, Cunningham pled guilty before the Honorable James E. Boasberg, Judge, Superior Court of the District of Columbia, to one count of First Degree Theft.

On July 9, 2007, Cunningham appeared before Judge Boasberg and was sentenced to 20 months incarceration (suspended), 3 years supervised probation, and ordered to pay the DMV \$3,490 in restitution, in accordance with D.C. Code § 22-3212.
